Section 1: Health, Safety & Medical

Medical Emergency Release & Information Each camper **MUST** have their own medical coverage. Students will not be allowed to attend unless the following information is submitted, and the form is signed by the parent or guardian of the student(s).

Medical Treatment & Health Policies

- **Accident Insurance:** Participants are responsible for their own accident insurance when using Camp Trinity facilities and when participating in Camp Trinity programs.
- **Medication:** Camp Trinity does not normally administer medications and will do so only when directed in writing by the child's parent or guardian. Medications must be in the original containers with written instructions for dispensation. All medications must be in a pharmacy labeled container with the name of the child below as the prescribed, name of the drug, strength, dosage, frequency, authorized prescriber and the date of the original prescription. Over the counter medication must be in the original container and labeled with the child's name and date of birth. Medications are not allowed to be sent with the

child. A parent or guardian must give the medication to a Camp Trinity employee. The staff of Camp Trinity will not administer shots or medications that have to be inserted into body cavities, with the exception of EpiPen or AuviQ injections. When special circumstances exist, personnel from Camp Trinity will be available to meet with the parent(s) or guardian(s) of the child in question and strive to develop through dialogue a mutually acceptable way to make sure the medication requirements of the child are met.

- **Blood Borne Pathogen Exposure:** I understand that, while my child is in the care of Camp Trinity, if a child is exposed to a bodily fluid on broken skin or mucus membrane (e.g., splashing in the mouth or eyes) from another child, Camp Trinity will contact the parents of both children. They will explain what has occurred and provide the name of the attending physician of the source child to parents of the exposed child. If a staff member has a blood or bodily fluid exposure from a child, Camp Trinity will provide the name and telephone number of the child's attending physician to the staff member. I have read and agree with the statement and specifically authorize Camp Trinity to release the name and telephone number of my child's physician and a description of the event to the parent or guardian of any child who is exposed to bodily fluid or to any staff member who experiences such an exposure from my child.
- **Lice:** I understand that, while my child is in the care of Camp Trinity, if a child is exposed to active lice from another child, Camp Trinity will contact the parents of both children. They will explain what has occurred, not using any identifying information, and the child with the active lice will be asked to leave the program for the day and not return until all active lice are removed and they are underway with a lice removal treatment. If an entire group of participants has been exposed to active lice, Camp Trinity will contact the parents of each exposed participant and explain the situation. I have read and agree with the statement and specifically authorize Camp Trinity to contact any child who is exposed to active lice or any staff member who experiences such an exposure from my child. I understand and agree that in the case of active lice, my child will be asked to leave the program for the day and will be unable to return until all active lice are removed and they have begun a lice treatment. I understand that refunds will not be remitted for any absences due to active lice.
- **Fever/Illness:** I understand that, while my child is in the care of Camp Trinity, if they have a fever over 100.4°F they will be asked to leave the program for the day and not return until they have been fever free for at least 24 hours without medical intervention, regardless of the resulting diagnosis. I understand and agree that in the case of fever, my child will be asked to leave the program for the day and will be unable to return until they are fever free for 24 hours without medical intervention. I understand that refunds will not be remitted for any absences due to illness.
- **Emergencies:** In the event of an emergency in which the parent/guardian or listed emergency contacts cannot be reached, Camp Trinity will contact emergency medical personnel and, pending their arrival, take those actions that are in Camp Trinity's judgement to be in the best interests of the child.

Parent/Guardian Medication Authorization I hereby request that any approved

medication, ordered by an authorized doctor for my child, be administered by the Camp Trinity health provider during the operating hours of Camp Trinity programs. I understand that I must supply the program with the appropriately prescribed medication in the original container dispensed and properly labeled by an authorized prescriber. Over the counter medications will be in their original packaging and have my child's full name clearly labeled. I understand that if not picked up, this medication will be destroyed after one (1) business week following the termination of the order or end of participation in Camp Trinity programs.

- I give my child permission to self-administer his/her prescribed inhaler or epi-pens as directed by the child's physician: **(Circle: Yes / No)**

Section 2: Camp Trinity Liability Release & Acknowledgement

Participation in a Camp Trinity involves the risk of injury including, but not limited to collision with other participants, being hit by the ball, falling onto the floor or into a wall, scratches, bruises, sprained and broken ankles and other body parts. By submitting this registration for my child's participation in this program, I acknowledge that I am requesting that my child have the opportunity to participate in this program and that I, on behalf of myself, my child, heirs, assigns, executors and administrators:

- Acknowledge all risks of injury associated with participation with Camp Trinity.
- Assume responsibility should injury result from these risks.
- Waive any legal rights we may have to seek payment of any kind from Trinity Academy and Camp Trinity, and the owners, operators, administrators, employees and agents of the facility at which Camp Trinity is being held for bodily injury or death resulting from participation in Camp Trinity, and to release these parties from any liability for damages resulting from injuries and death. Furthermore, this release explicitly includes claims arising from ordinary negligence.
- Acknowledge that no additional insurance coverage is provided by Camp Trinity, and the owners, operators, administrators, employees and agents of the facility where Camp Trinity is being held.
- Agree to follow all rules and procedures of the program and reasonable instructions of the coaches and Camp Trinity employees.

Section 3: Program Policies

Please read each of the following policies and sign below to indicate your understanding of these policies. Policies are subject to all applicable laws.

Waivers & Permissions

- **Campus Boundaries:** I permit my child to participate in activities Camp Trinity conducts outside the fenced-in play areas at Camp Trinity's facilities.

- **Field Trips:** I permit my child to leave Camp Trinity on authorized trips under the supervision of Camp Trinity staff.
- **Photography/Audio:** I give Camp Trinity and its employees and agents permission to use for any lawful purpose my and/or my child's likeness, image, voice and/or appearance as such may be embodied in any pictures, drawings, renderings, photographs, video recordings, audiotapes, digital images or the like, with the understanding that Camp Trinity will not publish my child's name. I agree that Camp Trinity has complete ownership of such pictures, etc., including but not limited to illustrations, bulletins, exhibitions, videotapes, reprints, reproductions, publications, advertisements and any promotional or educational materials in any medium now known or later developed, including but not limited to the internet, television, radio, newspapers, magazines, social media sites (e.g., Instagram, Facebook, Twitter, TikTok, etc.), and/or Camp Trinity audio, print or internet publications. I also agree that Camp Trinity has permission to release such pictures, etc. to the news media. I acknowledge that I will not receive any compensation or remuneration for the use of such pictures, etc. I understand that once such pictures, etc. are published to the media or on the internet, or are otherwise published, they may be used in publications and/or on websites outside of Camp Trinity's control.
- **Transportation:** I understand and agree that for Camp Trinity programs providing transportation for my child, Camp Trinity's liability for my child begins when the child boards a Camp Trinity vehicle and ends when the child exits the vehicle. Under some circumstances, Camp Trinity liability will continue if my child is exiting the Camp Trinity vehicle to participate in a Camp Trinity program. Pickup and drop off points will be determined prior to my child attending the program for which he/she is registered. If Camp Trinity staff encounters circumstances that they perceive as dangerous at the location where my child is scheduled to exit a Camp Trinity vehicle, my child will not be permitted to exit.
- **Babysitting Policy:** Camp Trinity strives to employ the very best staff possible in all of our programs. During staff time off or after they are no longer employed with Camp Trinity, these persons are private citizens and are no longer subject to our employment rules and procedures. Camp Trinity cannot and does not endorse or recommend its present or former staff members as babysitters to any parent or guardian of any child in any of our programs. Any babysitting arrangements with present or former staff of Camp Trinity is separate and independent from any Camp Trinity program and must be based on the independent investigation, responsibility and judgment of the parent or guardian. I agree that Camp Trinity shall not be responsible and will be held harmless from any claims or liability in connection with such babysitting activities.
- **Indemnity:** I understand that Camp Trinity activities have inherent risks, and I hereby assume all risks and hazards incident to my participation/my child's participation in all Camp Trinity activities, and recreation activities provided by third party vendors. I further waive, release, absolve, indemnify and agree to hold harmless Camp Trinity and its employees, organizers, volunteers, vendors, supervisors, officers, directors, participants, coaches and referees, as well as all persons or parents transporting participants to and from activities, from any legal claims, liabilities, damages and costs for any physical injury or damage to my personal property sustained during my use of Camp Trinity property

and/or my participation/my child's participation in any Camp Trinity activities. This includes claims arising from ordinary negligence.

- **Personal Items:** I understand that Camp Trinity is not responsible for any personal items lost or stolen at our programs.
- **Inclement Weather:** I understand that programs are not available when school is closed due to inclement weather.

Payment Policies

- **Outstanding Balances:** I understand the policies concerning payment, cancellation, and refunds. I may not register my child for a new program until outstanding balances due on past programs of Camp Trinity are paid.
- **Insufficient Funds:** If my bank returns a draft or check, due to insufficient funds, immediate payment is required to keep my child's account and registrations up to date. I understand that I will be charged \$35.00 for each returned check or draft. Payment in full is required before my child can continue to participate in Camp Trinity programs.
- **Cancellations:** Nonattendance, without written notice 30 days prior to cancellation, does not relieve me of the responsibility to pay for the program.
- **Refunds:** I understand that nonattendance does not entitle me to a refund. I understand that no refunds or adjustments are granted for illness, vacation, or when Camp Trinity programs are cancelled or altered due to inclement weather. I understand that Camp Trinity reserves the right to apply any credit due to other outstanding balances. I understand that suspension or expulsion of myself/my child from a Camp Trinity program due to inappropriate or prohibited behavior will not entitle me to a refund. Deposits are nonrefundable.
- **Late Fees:** Under normal operations, Camp Trinity runs from 2:30pm-6pm Monday-Friday. Exceptions include but are not limited to Early Release Days, School's Out Days, and special Trinity-wide occasions. We give a ten-minute grace period for the first three late pick-ups should the parent/guardian inform Camp Trinity employees ahead of time of their lateness. After this, your student's enrollment in the Camp Trinity program is subject to review and may be suspended if we note a continued failure to arrive on time for pickup. Additionally, you may incur a late fee of \$1.00 per minute should you be late picking your child up on multiple occasions.

Section 4: Behavior Expectations and Discipline Policies

It is important that staff maintain good order and discipline in all programs. Top objectives in all Camp Trinity programs are safety and a positive atmosphere for learning and developing social skills. Camp Trinity makes every effort to help children understand clear definitions of acceptable and unacceptable behavior. Camp Trinity does not condone and will not permit corporal punishment; ridiculing, threatening, using an inappropriate loud voice; leaving children unsupervised; or use of profanity.

A child's behavior is expected to be consistent with the following:

- Use appropriate language at all times.
- Cooperate with staff and follow directions.
- Respect other children and staff, equipment and facilities, and yourself.
- Maintain a positive attitude.
- Stay in program areas; running away is not acceptable.
- Participate successfully within the Camp Trinity staff-child ratios specific for each program.

Discipline Policy

- If a child is unable to comply with the behavior expectations, a conference will be held by the program director with the child. The parent(s)/guardian will be notified.
- If after the above meeting the child is still unable to comply with the behavior expectations, the program director will set up a conference with the parent(s)/guardian. A behavior contract will be established and signed by the parent(s)/guardian and the program director.
- If the child's behavior continues to be disruptive and/or unsafe, the child will be subject to suspension or dismissal.
- Failure of the parent(s)/guardian to attend conference(s) and cooperate will subject the child to suspension or dismissal.

Behaviors which may result in immediate suspension or dismissal include, but are not limited to:

- Any action that could threaten or pose a direct threat to the physical/emotional safety of the child, other children or staff. Prohibited conduct may include, but is not limited to, abusive jokes, insults, slurs, threats, name calling, bullying or intimidation.
- Fighting.
- Possession of a weapon of any kind.
- Vandalism, destruction, or theft of Camp Trinity property or property of others.
- Sexual misconduct.
- Possession of or use of alcohol or controlled substances unless under the prescription of a doctor.
- Running away.
- Biting.

I understand and acknowledge that: (i) it is the responsibility of the parent(s)/guardian to make full disclosure to Camp Trinity of any special circumstances which may affect the ability of my child/ward to participate, as described above; (ii) it is the responsibility of the parent(s)/guardian to inform Camp Trinity of any requested accommodation believed by the parent(s)/guardian to be necessary and readily achievable for such participation; and (iii) full disclosure of any special circumstances is material to Camp Trinity's evaluation of the child's/ward's ability to participate and Camp Trinity's consideration of any requested accommodation. I have read, understand and agree with the policies as stated in this document and have discussed the expectations of behavior with my child/ward. I understand

that Camp Trinity has the authority to revoke my child's right to participate in Camp Trinity programs for behavior which is not in keeping with the mission of Camp Trinity or for failing to follow the policies/procedures of Camp Trinity.
